BEAVER DAMAGE ISSUES

DISCUSSION	LEWIS outlined the history of the issue and action taken by the board to date. Beavers have moved into the middle pond, are cutting down many trees in the area, have obstructed drainage from the pond, have starter filling the drain pipe that leads under the road and community with debris, and have created potential safety issues by creating thin ice areas on the pond. The tree loss affects aesthetics and therefore property values. The drainage obstruction has created storm-water management problems and has raised the water level in the pond, leading to the submersion of some shoreline trees, which will likely lead to tree death. Filling of the drainage pipe under the roadway with debris affects community infrastructure and will likely result in costly repairs as the debris continue to build. Possible safety issues are self-explanatory. The board contacted DNR and was referred to a trapper who could remediate the problem by removing the beavers. The trapper came out to the community to assist the board. Some homeowners asked for further discussion before any action was taken. The board distributed a letter to homeowners on the middle pond inviting comment on the problem. Mark Petrie, 7963 Thornapple Club Dr., generally wanted the beavers to stay, but understood the problems presented and the need for action.
